Juvenile Justice System Contact Points Definitions - Problems

Youth Population:	Ages 10-17
Arrest	Juvenile arrest or citation
Current Problem	not reported by race in the Uniform Crime Report only locally
Juvenile Court Referrals:	includes referral to Juvenile, Circuit, and Municipal Court
Current Problem	juvenile court is only 10-15% of court referrals, no data w/ Circuit Municipal courts
Diversion:	includes alternative handling, formal diversion w/ or without supervision, referral to other program, services
Current Problem	no state-wide data collection / some data possible at local levels
Detention:	Juvenile detention center placement / 48 hour holding-staff secure / adult jail lock-up
Current Problem	No problem with data from 2007 forward; and earlier data maybe OK
Petition filed:	includes Juvenile Court Petition, Municipal Court charge, Circuit Court charge
Current Problem	Juvenile Court only is 10-15% of juvenile arrests; Circuit Court does not report juvenile data; Municipal Courts have no data reporting requirements, much less juvenile data
Found Delinquent:	Adjudicated in Juvenile Court, guilty in Municipal and Circuit Court
Current Problem	Juvenile Court only is 10-15% of juvenile arrests; Circuit Court does not report juvenile data; Municipal Courts have no data reporting requirements, much less juvenile data
Probation Supervision:	Supervision by county or state juvenile probation agency
Current Problem	DFS only statewide reporting; Sweetwater and Campbell County under contract w/ DFS contrary to state statute, but do they use state WyCaps system? No other reporting required locally.
Secure Confinement:	Juvenile Detention as a sentence (not holding for hearings or pending disp. or placement) Wyoming Boys' School, Wyoming Girls' School
Current Problem	No problem except determining sentenced youth in juvenile detention. This data should be available through the DFS system and juvenile detention roster
Transfer:	Direct file as Adult Felony Charge
Current Problem	Not reported centrally, could possibly be accessed by each Adult felony jurisdiction, either through District Court or Co. /District Atty

SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT (SPC) IMPLEMENTATION POTENTIAL FOR UNIFORM DATA COLLECTION

Single point of contact is the County Attorney / District Attorney
For reporting purposes it could be their designee, e.g. staff in office or another agency
etc.

Law enforcement reports to DCI for Uniform Crime Report and includes racial and ethnicity information

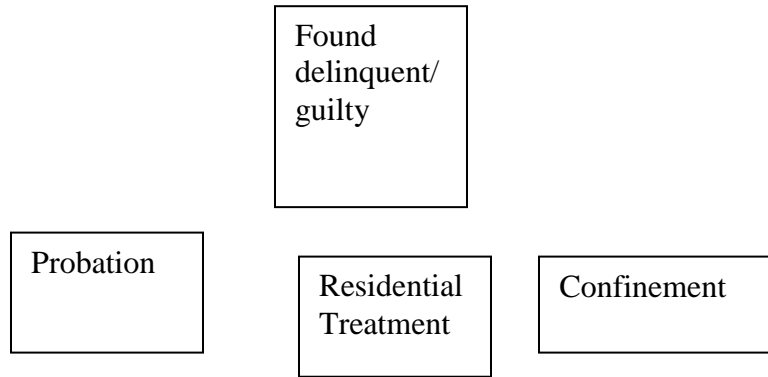

- 1) Youth Population at risk age 10-17 White 107,348; Black 1,837; Asian 792; Nat. Am. 6,823 *Indian pass through population OJJDP 2008
- 2) Arrest L.E. referral - Not available by race through the uniform crime report. Only available if the local jurisdiction captures the data and keeps it.
- 3) Juvenile Court Referrals – No data regarding the number of referrals, only of adjudications.

- 4) Diversion – No statewide data. There may possibly be some local data program to program.
- 5) Detention – Yes, statewide data collection and data base; by jurisdiction, race, offense, age, sex, court, referring agency, pre-court or post adjudication. This is the WCCA Juvenile Justice Project. Available from 2007 forward.
- 6) Petition Filed – No, only number of petitions adjudicated.
- 7) Found delinquent – Yes, but for only approximately 15% of total juvenile arrest cases which are filed in the District Juvenile Court. This would not provide a valid contact point for calculating the Relative Rate Index.
- 8) Probation supervision – DFS only reports statewide data, by County in District Juvenile Court. Does this include Campbell and Sweetwater Co. Juvenile Probation? Local jurisdictions may or may not keep their own data.
- 9) Secure Confinement – DFS: Wyoming Boys' School and Wyoming Girls' School non-secure confinement have data.
