SACJJ Grant Overview

Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG)

The goal of the JABG program is to reduce juvenile offending through supporting accountability-based programs that focus on offenders and state and local juvenile justice systems. The Department of Family Services is the designated state agency to receive, manage and administer JABG funds.

2006

Grant Period: November 2006 to November 2009

Seventeen (17) Cities and Counties were awarded JABG monies.

2007

Grant Period: June 2007 to May 2010

Eleven (11) Cities and Counties were awarded JABG monies.

2008

Grant Period: June 2008 to May 2011

Five (5) Cities and Counties were awarded JABG monies.

OJJDP established that an allocation of less than \$10,000 during a fiscal year will not be awarded to that unit of local government. Only allocations that exceeded \$10,000 were awarded to sub-grantees.

2009

Grant Period: June 2009 to May 2012

Date of Award: July 21, 2009. Amount of Award: \$299,600

Letters of Interest will be sent out to units of local government late August or September.

<u>Note:</u> DFS contracts with Allvest Information Services for the PACT Assessment. These expenses include training and travel for City and County Employees that are implementing the assessment tool. Currently, twelve cities/counties have been trained, and there are four more set to be trained in September. These expenses also include Onsite and Off-site Consultation by Allvest; Installation of the PACT program on Assessments.com; Integration and Customization (IT) of the site; yearly subscription to Assessments.com; and the annual maintenance and fees for the assessment.

Title V Community Prevention Grants Program

Title V is an Incentives Grant for Local Delinquency Prevention Programs. Currently, Wyoming has ten counties that are in compliance with the core requirements of the JJDP Act. Letters of Interest will be sent out in September to those counties that qualify and may be interested in receiving money to support juvenile justice programs in their community. A full range of evidence-based juvenile justice programs, from delinquency prevention and intervention to reentry, can be supported by Title V funds. Program areas may include, afterschool programs, mentoring, diversion, delinquency prevention, disproportionate minority contact, job training, rural area juvenile programs, substance abuse, youth courts, etc.

The grant recipient must match all Title V funds with 50 percent of the amount of the grant.

Technical Assistance and Training will then be provided to those units of local government that are interested in applying for Title V funding. The SAG Grants Committee will be involved in the application and awards process for these funds.
